Prizes: Prizes will be awarded to Low Gross and Low Net winners as well as Closest to the Pin Winners with the top 3 Low Net scores winning a Turkey.

Ties will be broken by USGA recommended guidelines using the final 6, final 3, and finally 9th hole.

RULES GOVERNING NAPERVILLE COUNTRY CLUB SCHEDULE OF PLAY

The Head Golf Professional may use discretion in allowing play other than the times permitted under the Schedule of Play. Spouses, Significant Others, children and stepchildren 8 to 17 years of age, of a Regular Member, while Members of his/her household shall have the privilege to play golf under the rules, policies and procedures established by the Naperville Country Club Board of Directors. Children under 8 years of age do not have playing privileges. Children under 12 years of age shall play only when accompanied by an adult.

RULES OF PLAY

The Golf Professional and/or the golf shop staff have been appointed by the Board to enforce these rules at all times. Remember, these rules and regulations are written and will be enforced for your benefit. Members and employees are encouraged to report violations. It is the Member's responsibility to see that the dress and behavior of their guests and Immediate Family are consistent with the rules applicable to the Club Members.

Junior Members are not eligible to play in Invitational, Men's Spring and Fall Championship, Men's Opener, President's Cup, Guest Day, or Member/Member. Club Events and Tournaments, Ladies 18-Hole and 9-Hole Leagues, and Junior Golf have priority over open play. Any female Member who elects to play in the Ladies 18-Hole or 9-Hole League waives her right to play during Member events.

Children or stepchildren 8 years of age and under are not allowed on the golf course as non-participants.

Incorrect charges for club care, handicap, guest fees, cart charges, merchandise purchases or lessons must be reconciled through the Golf Shop.



RULES OF PLAY CONT...

All Golf Shop Credit expires on December 31st in the year it was won. Sorry, there can be no exceptions.

Members from other clubs may be extended the courtesy of playing Naperville Country Club (Club) at the request of their golf professional.

All Members must register their guests by name in the Golf Shop prior to starting play.

Players are not permitted to start playing on #10 tee without permission from the Golf Professional. Players stopping for refreshments relinquish the right of way.

On Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, Spouses, Junior Members and guests are not permitted to tee off on #10 until the last group of Members, registered for a starting time at the Golf Shop, have cleared the #10 tee.

Any group with one hole open will permit the following group to play through. Proper etiquette suggests the following group be invited to play through; however, if the invitation is not forthcoming, the players being held up may request they be allowed to play through. The slower group must accede to this request. The Golf Captain will adjudicate grievances.

Matches containing more than four players must receive permission from the Professional Staff before teeing off. All participants must ride in a cart for the duration of the round.

All players are responsible for posting eligible 9 and 18 hole scores.

Handicaps are based on the USGA system.

The Golf Course Superintendent has full authority to close the golf course any time he believes play will be detrimental to the course.



LOCAL COURSE RULES

Play is governed by the current USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions.

Out of Bounds is beyond the boundaries of the course or any part of the course marked by the Committee. Out of Bounds is defined by WHITE stakes, WHITE lines or boundary fences.

Internal Out of Bounds Left Side of Hole #11. Local Rule E-5 is Mandatory – Provisional ball is not allowed.

The parking lot is Out of Bounds. The areas around the maintenance building and the clubhouse are out of bounds as marked.

Distance – Measuring Devices. A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures DISTANCE ONLY. However, if, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his playe (e.g.gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 4-3, for first breach from single act is general penalty and penalty for second breach is disqualification.

Penalty areas are defined by RED stakes or lines.

No Play Zones (NPZ) - formerly Environmentally Sensitive Areas (ESA) are defined by RED stakes with GREEN tops. Entry into these areas is not permitted.

No Play Zone Interference: A Player who must stand in a NPZ to play a ball outside an NPZ area "MUST" take relief from this situation. Determine the nearest point of relief no closer to the hole and drop the ball with in one club length. No Penalty.

Embedded Ball – Free relief is allowed when a player's ball is only embedded in the General Area. General Area covers the course except the teeing areas, all penalty areas, all bunkers and all greens. Drop within one club length from the spot of the embedded ball no near to the hole

A Ball entering the NPZ to the left of #11 and #17 and the penalty area to the Right of #13 (around the dorm building) may be dropped under penalty of one stroke in the drop area provided.

Annual course closure in November, date at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

RULES GOVERNING GUESTS

Guests shall be welcomed at the Club when accompanied and/or authorized by a sponsoring Member or the Member's Immediate Family. Appropriate guest fees and the circumstances under which guests may use the various facilities of the Club shall be established by the Board. All guest fees shall be charged to and be the responsibility of the sponsoring Member. Guests shall be subject to the Bylaws, Rules, Policies and Procedures of the Club. The sponsoring Member shall be responsible for the conduct, charges attributable to and actions of the Member's guests. A suspended or former expelled Member may not be a guest of another Member.

All Members in good standing shall have the privilege of personally inviting to the clubhouse and premises any guest (subject to prevailing guest fees) providing that any such person shall be introduced to play golf not more than six times per year regardless of host. The six times per year limitation does not apply to Immediate Family Members. Rounds played during the Invitational and Pump Day will not count in this limitation. If for any reason any individual has been deemed by the Board to be a "persona non-grata", that individual will not be allowed to golf or utilize the Club facilities as the guest of a Member. All member outings are subject to other guest restrictions.

Appropriate guest fees apply in all cases.

Immediate Family guest fees include a Member's mother, father, brother, sister, mother-in-law, father-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, sons and daughters who are not registered as Junior Members, stepchildren.

A Member shall be responsible for the nonpayment of any charges incurred or damage inflicted to Club property by his/her guests.

Foursomes containing more than one guest will not be allowed to tee off prior to 10:00AM on Saturdays and 9:00AM on Sundays or holidays.

Guests are those golfers for whom the Club has been paid a daily guest fee. Juniors, family members entitled to family privileges (spouses and minor children while residing in the Member's household) and associate Members may not play as guests.



RULES GOVERNING GUESTS ETC...

Members may introduce accompanied guests to the clubhouse at all times except for those Special Events so designated as "Members Only".

It is the responsibility of the Member to ensure their guests are aware of and conform to Club Rules including standards of dress and decorum.

Members are responsible for the payment of all guest uses of, or consumption in the clubhouse.

Guests must be accompanied by the sponsoring Member, unless prior arrangements have been made with the General Manager or Golf Professional.

Immediate Family Guest Rounds Limited to 15 rounds per season with Family Guest Fee. After 15 rounds, the family guest is required to pay Regular Guest Fee.

RULES GOVERNING SEVERE WEATHER

A sophisticated lightning "detection" system has been installed at the Club for the protection of the Members, their families and guests. The horn blown continuously for 15 seconds indicates a high probability of lightning striking within a 2 mile radius. All players must leave the course, putting green and range when this horn sounds and are not permitted to return to the course, putting green or range until the all clear sounds. The "all clear" signal is a series of three short horn blasts for five seconds each. This all clear is sounded automatically by the weather system.

The Golf Committee will at all times cancel Club events only if the course becomes unfit for play. The fact that there are no golf carts permitted on the course due to inclement weather does not necessarily mean that the course is unfit for play. Tournament refunds will be at the discretion of the General Manager or Golf Professional.



RULES GOVERNING HARRASSMENT

Naperville Country Club is committed to maintaining an environment that is free of unlawful harassment. In keeping with that commitment, the Club will not tolerate harassment of Members. Immediate Family, guests or employees by anyone, including any supervisor, co-worker, vendor, Member or guest of Member or the Club itself. Unlawful harassment consists of unwelcomed conduct, or that which creates an intimidating or offensive environment, and may include making unwelcome comments about a person's clothing, body or personal life style; offensive or abusive physical contact: use of offensive nicknames or terms of endearment: offensive jokes or unwelcome innuendoes; any suggestion that sexual activities, race, gender, religion, national origin, age, disability, sexual orientation, marital status, or any other protected classification would affect one's job, promotion, performance evaluation, or working conditions; displaying or circulation of offensive objects, pictures, literature, or Internet web sites; and other conduct that, even if not offensive to some employees, creates a working environment that may be considered by others to be offensive or hostile.

All Club Members and employees are responsible for helping to assure that harassment is avoided. If you feel that you have experienced or witnessed harassment, you are required to notify the General Manager, House Chairman or Club President immediately. The Club forbids retaliation against anyone who has reported harassment.

RULES GOVERNING CONFLICT OF INTEREST

It is the Club's policy not to purchase from, sell to, or otherwise transfer goods or services from or to a Member, employee, or to a person or entity directly or indirectly affiliated with a Member or employee.

RULES GOVERNING CONFLICT OF INTEREST CONT...

However, when it appears that it is in the Club's best interest to make such a purchase, sale or transfer, and a Member or employee is affiliated with a person or entity seeking to do business with the Club; the matter shall be brought to the Board of Directors for approval. The identity of the Member shall be disclosed, and no Director who is affiliated with the person or entity offering goods or services shall participate in the discussion or vote on the proposed transaction.

Each Director and each senior staff employee will execute an annual Disclosure Statement within 30 days following the Club's Annual Meeting describing all of the above proposed or actual transactions which they or their affiliates have engaged in with the Club during the 12 months preceding the Statement. If there have been no such transactions, the Disclosure Statement will so indicate.

RULES GOVERNING FIREARMS

As posted at each entryway, Naperville Country Club prohibits all persons who enter Club property from carrying a handgun, firearm, or weapon of any kind onto the property regardless of whether the person is licensed to carry a concealed handgun. This policy applies to all Members, guests, employees, vendors and contractors on Club property, whether or not they are licensed to carry a concealed handgun. The only exceptions to this policy are law enforcement officers.

GOLF ETIQUETTE POLICY

All players are expected to conduct themselves appropriately on the golf course.

Repair their own ball mark and one other on every green.



GOLF ETIQUETTE POLICY CONT...

See that sand bunkers are properly raked. Smooth out footprints or holes in sand bunkers with the rakes provided. Leave rakes inside bunkers

Sand bunkers should be entered from the low side and exited from the same point of entry.

Repair and replace all divots on the tees and fairways.

Practice should be confined to the designated practice areas. Repetitively hitting from the same location on the course is prohibited.

Divots on the practice tee should be taken in a line rather that scattering divots.

Confine cart traffic to designated cart paths and obey all cart signs and roped areas. Avoid driving on green banks and tee banks. No carts on greens or tees.

Do not roll hand carts across any part of the green (including aprons), tees or sand bunkers.

Help keep the course clean. Use the containers provided.

While it is usually the task of the caddie to perform these duties, it is the sole responsibility of the golfer to see that they are completed properly.

CADDIE POLICY

Caddies are encouraged at the Club and are a vital part of the NCC experience. In keeping with this philosophy, at least one caddie is recommended to be in each group on Saturday, Sunday, and Holiday mornings (policy based on caddie availability).



GOLF CAR POLICY

All powered golf cars shall be operated responsibly whenever on the course or club property.

By responsibly, we mean:

Operation of golf cars are restricted to those individuals at least 18 years of age.

Only 2 riders per golf car.

No riders are permitted on the back of the golf car.

Golf cars are not allowed to tow pull-carts.

Golf cars are not to be operated while intoxicated.

Golf cars will use cart paths whenever possible.

Golf cars will stay on cart paths on all par 3 holes (#3, #7, #10, #17).

Golf cars will respect all ropes and directional signs.

Operators will set the parking brake whenever exiting the golf car.

"Make your own path" – avoid driving in trafficked areas made by other golf cars.

Golf cars will avoid wet areas, side slopes and where turf is wilted.

Golf car traffic will scatter at the entrance and exit of all cart paths.

Park golf cars with all four wheels on cart path.

Avoid low hanging tree limbs and other obstacles.

Golf cars are rented on a first-come-first-serve basis when available.

Any cosmetic or mechanical damage to a golf car will be the responsibility of the Member or operator.

Members are responsible for golf car usage of their guests.

These same regulations apply to all motorized riding vehicles (Segways, hover carts, etc.).



GOLF CAR POLICY CONT...

Daily golf car availability is the decision of the Golf Course Superintendent.

Members are strictly responsible for their guests' and their own safe operation of the golf cars so as not to interfere with fellow players' enjoyment of the game, and at all times guarding against injury to persons or damage to property, especially the playing surfaces of the golf course.

Each Member (and sponsoring Member if the golf car user is the guest or Immediate Family of a Member) agrees to indemnify and hold the Club, its officers, directors and employees, harmless from any and all injury, damage or claims of any nature whatsoever whether to person, property, or both, that may arise out of, or result from or through the use of a golf car by that Member, the Member's Immediate Family or guest. All Members and their guests are required to obey all golf car signs on the course and displayed in the golf car itself.

The Club assumes no responsibility for injury or damage caused by golf cars. Only food, beverages and coolers purchased from the Club will be allowed in the golf cars. All players agree to pay or reimburse the Club for any and all charges arising out of or breakages, shortages or damages to the golf car other than ordinary wear and tear. The golf car operator (and sponsoring Member if the operator is the Immediate Family or guest of a Member) agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the Club, its officers, directors and employees, agents harmless from any and all claims for injury. damage of any nature whatsoever whether to person, property, or both, that may arise out of, or result from or through the use of the golf car by the person operating the golf car, excepting only such injury or damage which solely and proximately results from the negligence or willful or wanton act of a Club Director, Officer, employee or agent or the golf car's manufacturer. Enforcement of the golf car rules shall be the responsibility of all Members, the Golf Professional, and staff. Violations shall be reported to the Golf. Professional's staff and/or General Manager. Violations will be addressed according to the Club's Disciplinary Procedure. Both the operator and the passenger, if a Member, may be sanctioned for violations.



SPECIAL ACCESS PROGRAM

Golfers with physical limitations, who need to drive their golf car closer to tees and greens than afforded by the cart paths, can request a special access permit at any time during the golf season.

Valid permit holders will receive a special flag (w/NCC logo) to attach to their carts during the golf season. Special Access permit holders will keep carts a minimum of 10 yards from all greens.

The Pro Shop staff will administer the Special Access Program.

Special Access Program permits will be granted to any golfer presenting either a letter from their physician stating their physical limitations and need for a Special Access permit OR a valid State of Illinois handicapped parking permit.

A Special Access Program permit can be used for the entire golf season, and must be renewed at the beginning of each new golf season.

CELL PHONE & ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

To preserve the integrity of the Club and out of respect for Members and their guests, cellular phones and other forms of electronic communication devices must be in their silent, vibrate or ringer off mode at all times while on the golf course. The use of cellular phones and other forms of electronic communication devices shall be limited to personal and medical emergencies or as required by medical professionals on an emergency basis. Members shall not slow up play or distract their fellow Members when using cellular phones and other forms of electronic communication devices.

While the use of cellular phones and other forms of electronic communications is permitted in the Clubhouse, out of respect for Members and their guests individuals are asked to be discrete. Keep cell phones and electronic communication devices in their silent, vibrate or ringer off mode whenever possible. Limit their use, and step out of the dining areas to take calls.



CELL PHONE & ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY CONT...

We understand that the workplace has changed. Please limit your use of computers for email or meetings to private areas of the clubhouse. All computers must be stored after 5:00 p.m.

COURSE AND CLUBHOUSE DRESS CODE POLICY

The Club's dress code applies to all Members, their families (including children and stepchildren), and guests. NCC strives to provide an upscale casual social environment. The purpose of the dress code is to ensure that proper respect is shown to all Members, their families and guests when using the Club. The Board has directed that the management team be empowered to enforce the dress code, and thereby deny privileges to Members, Immediate Family and guests who do not conform to the dress code. The Club's management shall have sole discretion and authority in matters of appropriateness of attire

Clothes deemed inappropriate at all times at NCC include: any kind of apparel that is frayed, cut, stained, ill-fitting or soiled, swimwear, sports jerseys, t-shirts, gym clothes, sweats (shirts/pants), cutoffs, tank tops, midriffs, halter tops, short shorts, short skirts, shower shoes, golf shoes with metal spikes and any hat worn with the bill not facing forward.

COURSE AND CLUBHOUSE DRESS CODE POLICY CONT

Golf

When dressing for golf, Members are encouraged to exhibit respect for tradition and modesty. Under no circumstance is denim, of any kind or color, allowed on the golf course. Proper golf attire includes:

Men: A shirt with a collar or a "mock" collar, slacks, shorts of moderate length

Women: Shirts must have a collar or sleeves, skirts of moderate length, shorts of moderate length

Clubhouse

The dress code in the clubhouse is slightly more relaxed than the golf course. Appropriate denim is allowed in the clubhouse and on the patio. Appropriate denim is defined as: properly sized, in excellent condition, consistent in color, free of holes/rips/tears, no frays, no denim shirts/bibs/painter pants. Shirts should be tucked in unless they are tailored for outside wear. Hats are allowed in the: locker rooms, Pro-Shop, Pump Room West, Pump Room and on the Patio prior to 5:00 PM. Men are not allowed to wear hats in the: Ballroom, Grille-on-the-Green, Club 21, or Fireside. Hats are not permitted in Pump room and Pump Room West after 5:00 PM. Dressy hats, religious or health related head coverings will be allowed for appropriate occasions. Men may be required to wear a jacket and/or necktie for specific events.

Men: A shirt with a collar or a "mock" collar, slacks, shorts of moderate length

Women: Skirts of moderate length, shorts of moderate length

If you are ever in doubt about suitable attire for a specific event, or what attire is appropriate for a specific area of the Club, please feel free to contact the Club for assistance.
